Nick Virgilio Writers House Designated as a Literary Landmark by the New Jersey Centery for the Book (Affiliate of the Library of Congress)!



2025 LITERARY LANDMARK DESIGNATION CELEBRATION

THE NICK VIRGILIO WRITERS HOUSE







<u>The New Jersey Center for the Book (NJCB), an affiliate</u> of the Library of Congress, has chosen the Nick Virgilio Writers House as the 2025 recipient of its Literary Landmark Award.

We know that none of this would have been possible without the support of every consultant, partner, funder, and poet who keeps this organization going, and we want to thank you for supporting NHVA.

The Center for the Book names a Literary Landmark in each state annually, representing the state's literary, scientific, or artistic heritage and legacy. The selection of the Nick Virgilio Writers House recognizes the organization's commitment to promoting literacy, creativity, self-expression and the literary legacy of Camden poet Nick Virgilio – whose archives are preserved at the house. The Writers House operates under the Nick Virgilio Haiku Association, founded in 1989 to promote the writing of haiku poetry and to encourage young people to write poetry and further

the work of Virgilio, who remains a world renowned haiku poet. Previous recipients of the Literary Landmark Award include the Newark Public Library, the Walt Whitman House, and Rutgers Institute of Jazz Studies.

The award is bestowed on NVHA largely due to the work of archivist and poet Sean William Lynch, who has completed the conservation and cataloguing phase of NVHA's literary preservation project under the tutelage of emeritus Rutgers Camden professor Dr. Geoffrey Sill, and to NVHA's foray into teaching haiku in Camden schools.

The historical preservation project includes hundreds of documents that are either rare or one of a kind artifacts of the Camden poet Nick Virgilio. Their current work consists of writing and editing the manuscript of historical correspondences between Nick Virgilio and other prominent poets during the era of the burgeoning English-language haiku movement, which will be published as a book to convey the significance of haiku in literature to a wider audience, and to give Camden city and county residents the opportunity to explore the rich history of the arts in South Jersey that is often overlooked. The completed project will feature a digital platform that will complement an in-person exhibit at the Writers House where users can explore Virgilio's life, work, and his influence on the haiku community through online annotations, creating a cohesive, immersive educational experience for all visitors.

In 2025 NVHA began teaching haiku in Camden public schools, with the added goal of highlighting the introspective nature of writing poetry. The initiative's objectives are to increase access to creative writing education, build students' capacity for contemplation and reflection, and equip children with early written communication skills. After a short development phase with poet/educator Warren Longmire and Vanessa Woods, LPC, the organization debuted a healing-centered and project-based poetry curriculum for children ages 9-12 at Cooper's Poynt Family School and Davis Elementary School. Taught by longtime haiku educator Therese Halscheid and Sacred Heart teacher and Camden resident Jovaan Torres, the curriculum emphasized the meditative and reflective nature of writing, a powerful tool in helping developing minds process and navigate difficult experiences.

Open Call for Board Members Who Reside and/or Work in Camden, NJ

Founded in 1989 to honor Camden city native and haiku poet Nick Virgilio, NVHA is a writing and poetry education organization dedicated to the creative and

mindful exercise of the written word in all forms, but especially haiku and short-form poetry. We encourage literacy and all forms of written creative arts, while fostering a sense of connected community.

To better serve and represent the Camden poetry community, we invite Camden residents and/or workers to apply for a seat on the NVHA Board of Directors. This application is open to all, but priority will be given to people who work, reside, or have a connection to Camden, NJ. (Particularly those who bring skills in education, poetry, administration, fundraising, and/or a passion for creating a stronger community.)

We have an exciting and engaged working board that boasts diverse professional backgrounds. Board members are required to participate in **a minimum of 7 out of 12 board conference calls per year (which may be virtual conference calls or in-person),** and are expected to commit to their seat for a minimum of one year. All Board members are also encouraged to help design and participate in fundraising and development activities throughout the year.
